Requirements

- 1. A qualified patient or patient's designated caregiver may possess no more than six (6) flowering mature plants and twelve (12) juvenile plants at any given time.
- 2. A multiple patients' designated caregiver:
 - a. May possess no more than more than six (6) flowering mature plants and twelve (12) juvenile plants per qualified patient at any given time.
 - b. Can only operate a single cultivation site (not including the patient's residence)
 - c. Needs to meet the requirements for a Commercial Cultivation License if growing for more than 3 qualified patients; for more than 5 qualified patients, needs to obtain a commercial cultivation license.
- 3. Cultivation Sites:
 - a. Qualified Patient's residence; or
 - b. Designated Caregiver's residence; or
 - c. Another site owned or possessed by qualified patient or patient's designated caregiver
- 4. May only cultivate indoors and cannot be visible to the public.
- 5. Cannabis plants must be secured in a room with a lockable door and harvested cannabis must be stored in a secure area and accessible only to the qualified patient or designated caregiver.
- 6. Cannabis shall not be cultivated in the common areas of any multi-family complex.
- 7. DPHSS may inspect the cultivation site after giving the qualified patient a 24-hour notice.
- 8. DPHSS may revoke the home cultivation permit for failure to follow P.L. 34-125.
- 9. Need to follow regulations regarding destruction and disposal of medical cannabis (P.L. 34-80, §10222 and §10234).



Medical Cannabis Home Cultivation Information for Qualified Patients



<u>Procedure to obtain a Home Cultivation Permit for a</u> <u>Qualified Patient who plans to cultivate marijuana.</u>

- 1. Pick up the following forms at DPHSS:
 - a. Form 1A Registry ID Card Application
 - b. Form 2A Written Certification
 - c. Form 2B Written Designation for Caregiver
 - d. Form 2C Qualified Patient Registration (No Registry ID Card)
 - e. Form 3A Patient Home Cultivation Permit Application
 - f. Form 3C Property Owner's Authorization to Cultivate
- 2. A practitioner must complete and sign Form 2A and fax or email a scanned copy to DPHSS within 24 hours of signing it. The patient must submit the **original** for authentication. It is valid for one year from date when the practitioner signed the form. A list of authorized practitioners can be found at <u>dphss.guam.gov</u>.
- 3. The patient must complete:
 - a. Either Form 1A or Form 2C
 - b. Form 3A
 - c. Form 3C
 - d. Form 2B if patient has a designated caregiver
- 4. Submit the forms to Central Public Health Room 225 in Mangilao, Monday to Friday 8:00 -12:00 pm (except holidays)
- 5. Need to bring the following:
 - a. Valid government issued photo-ID (driver's license, State/Guam ID, or passport)
 - b. If a patient is a minor, the caregiver needs to bring one of the following:

- i. Birth certificate
- ii. Adoption papers
- iii. Court order
- iv. Guardianship papers
- 6. Pay the <u>appropriate</u> non-refundable fees at the Cashier:
 - a. To authenticate Form 2A (written certification) = \$1.00
 - b. Registry ID Card = \$15.00
 - c. Home Cultivation Permit = \$15.00
- 7. DPHSS shall approve or deny the application within thirty (30) calendar days.
- 8. The Registry ID Card is valid for one year from date of issue. It is recommended that the qualified patient have the card with them at all times.
- 9. The Home Cultivation Permit is valid for one year from date of issue. Once a dispensary is operational, the permit is no longer valid.
- 10. A Qualified Patient is subject to criminal and civil penalties for activities not permitted by P.L. 33-220, P.L. 34-80 and P.L. 34-125 (10 GCA. Chap 12, §122505)

Definitions:

Practitioner is a person licensed in Guam to prescribe and administer drugs that are subject to the Guam Uniform Controlled Substances Act (except a veterinarian). **Primary Caregiver** is at least 21 years old who is registered with DPHSS and who has been designated by the qualified patient to assist in the medical use of cannabis. **Designated Caregiver** is a primary caregiver who assists in the cultivation of medical cannabis. **Qualified Patient** is a person in Guam who has been diagnosed by a practitioner as having a debilitating medical condition and has received written certification for the medical use of cannabis.
