Requirements

- A qualified patient and a designated caregiver may possess no more than six (6) flowering mature plants and twelve (12) juvenile plants at any given time.
- 2. A multiple patients' designated caregiver:
 - a. May possess no more than more **than six (6) flowering mature plants and twelve (12) juvenile plants per qualified patient** at any given time.
 - b. Can only operate a single cultivation site (not including the patient's residence).
 - c. Needs to meet the requirements of a Commercial Cultivation License if growing for more than 3 qualified patients and if more than 5 qualified patients, needs to obtain a cultivation license.
- 3. May only cultivate indoors and cannot be visible to the public.
- 4. Cannabis plants must be secured in a room with a lockable door.
- 5. Harvested cannabis must be stored in a secure area and accessible only to the qualified patient or designated caregiver.
- 6. Cannabis shall not be cultivated in the common areas of any multi-family complex.
- 7. DPHSS may inspect the cultivation site after giving a 24-hour notice.
- 8. DPHSS may revoke a permit for failure to follow P.L. 34-125.
- 9. Need to follow regulations regarding destruction and disposal of medical cannabis (P.L. 34-80, §10222 and §10234).

Medical Cannabis Home Cultivation Information for Designated Caregiver



<u>Procedure to obtain a Home Cultivation Permit for</u> <u>Caregiver</u>

- 1. Pick up the following forms at DPHSS:
 - a. Form 1A Registry ID Card Application
 - b. Form 2B-Written Designation for Caregiver
 - c. Form 2D Caregiver Registration
 - d. Form 3B Designated Caregiver Home Cultivation Permit Application
 - e. Form 4A Application for Medical Cannabis License
- 2. The Designated Caregiver must complete:
 - a. Forms 1A, 2B, 2D, and 3B
 - b. Form 4A if cultivating marijuana for more than three (3) patients outside the patients' residences
- 3. Submit the forms at Central Public Health Room 225 in Mangilao, Monday to Friday 8:00 -12:00 pm (except holidays)
- 4. Needs to bring the following:
 - a. Valid government issued photo-ID (driver's license, Guam ID, or passport)
 - b. If a patient is a minor, the primary caregiver needs to bring one of the following:
 - i. Birth certificate
 - ii. Adoption papers
 - iii. Court order
 - iv. Guardianship papers
 - c. Proof that authorization was obtained from homeowner's association or landowner to cultivate and store marijuana on the premises.

- d. Documents as required in forms 1A, 3B and/or 4A
- 5. Pay the <u>appropriate</u> non-refundable fees at the Cashier:
 - a. Registry ID Card = \$100
 - b. Home Cultivation Permit = \$15
 - c. Medical Cannabis License = \$10/patient
- 6. DPHSS shall approve or deny the application within thirty (30) calendar days.
- 7. The Registry ID Card is valid for one year from date of issue. It is recommended that the designated caregiver have the card with them at all times.
- 8. The Home Cultivation Permit is valid for one year from date of issue. Once a dispensary is operational, the permit is no longer valid.
- A Designated Caregiver is subject to criminal and civil penalties for activities not permitted by P.L. 33-220, P.L. 34-80 and P.L. 34-125 (10 GCA. Chap 12, §122505)

Definitions:

Primary Caregiver is at least 21 years old who is registered with DPHSS and who has been designated by the qualified patient to assist in the medical use of cannabis. **Designated Caregiver** is a primary caregiver who assists in the cultivation of medical cannabis. **Qualified Patient** is a person of Guam who has been diagnosed by a practitioner as having a debilitating medical condition and has received written certification for the medical use of cannabis.
