Simplified Reporting System and Periodic Change Report (HANDOUT)

What is Simplified Reporting and what do I have to do:

The Simplified Reporting System (SRS) is a way for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Cash Assistance Program (CAP) and Medical Assistance Program (MAP) clients to report changes. You need to report only when your income exceeds the gross income for your household size shown below by the 10th day of the following month in which the change occurred. (Ex: A change that occurs in Aug. must be reported by Sept. 10th)

Periodic Change Report (PCR)

When and How do I file an PCR?

Six (6) months after application/renewal date, **you must** submit a PCR between the 1st and 10th of the month after you receive the form to the SNAP Office that handles your case (Northern - Dededo, Central - Mangilao or Southern - Inarajan). Example: If you receive the form in May, complete form between June 1 to June 10, sign and return to SNAP Office no later than June 10th.

IMPORTANT: If you submit PCR before June 1st, it will be returned to you.

If you submit PCR after June 30th, you will need to re-apply for SNAP.

-Trading SNAP or CAP for controlled substances such as drugs	1 st offense: 24 months		
	2 nd offense: Permanently		
-Trading SNAP and/or CAP for firearms, ammunition or explosives	Permanently		
-Trading, buying or selling SNAP and/or CAP of \$500 or more			
-Giving False information about who you are or where you live so	10 years for each offense
