### **2015 Cancer Education Conference**

The 2015 Cancer Education Conference was held on July 18, 2015 at the Pacific Star Resort and Spa. The conference targeted medical and allied health professionals, clinic staff, students, and community members who wanted to learn more information regarding breast and cervical cancer prevention and control.

There were three presentations conducted: 1) *Cervical Cancer and HPV Vaccination* by Dr. Dennis Albino from FHP Health Center; *The Genetics of Breast Cancer* by Dr. Paul C. Coty from Guam Regional Medical City; and *Primary Management of Breast and Cervical Cancer: Best Practice* by Dr. Don Dizon from Massachusetts General Hospital Cancer Center.

The presentations provided a wealth of information on breast and cervical cancer prevention and control. Dr. Albino discussed the epidemiology and biology of cervical cancer, management of premalignant disease, treatment option, and prevention such as HPV Vaccination. Dr. Coty discussed in-depth the BRCA 1 and BRCA2 genes which causes breast cancer; and Dr. Dizon discussed staging of breast and cervical cancers, and approaches to early versus advanced breast and cervical cancer.

More than 100 participants attended the conference. The conference presentations were well received with an average rating of 4.82 out of 5. Participants' feedback was positive. Many of them stated that the conference was informative. The speakers were great and have mastery in their respective fields.

The conference was hosted by the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Program in partnership with the CCC Screening, Early Detection and Treatment Action Team and the Guam Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program. In addition, the program worked with the Guam Nurses Association who provided the nursing continuing education credit hours.

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### "It Is Time: A Dialogue on Cancer Screening and Prevention"

Guam Cancer Care held its "It Is Time" Town Hall at the Santa Rita Community Center in March of this year. Continuing in this cancer screening and prevention outreach, the second Town Hall took place at the Tamuning Senior Citizen Center on June 16-17, 2015.

The forum's objective is to give insight on current and forthcoming topics related to the screening and prevention of cancer. Local and offisland medical providers will give an insight on current and forthcoming topics related to the importance of cancer screening and prevention and be able to engage in discussion.

We know that Guam's cancer screening rates compared to the U.S. rates are significantly lower and needed to be improved in order to detect cancer at its earliest stages. Many cancer and healthcare organizations have come together to take a stand against cancer and encourages a proactive approach to health through screening. Of the many Guam residents afflicted with cancer over the past many years, statistics have shown residents are being diagnosed at the later stages of cancer, thus reflecting the need for our island community to take the "proactive" approach to their health care.

There were seven presentations conducted: Prostate Cancer (Dr.

Ramsey Chichakli, Guam Regional Medical City); Lung Cancer (Dr. Samuel Friedman, Cancer Center of Guam); Cervical Cancer (Dr. Kin-Sing Au); Increasing Breast Cancer Awareness (Dr. Gemma Leonora Uy, St. Luke's Medical Center Global City); Minimally Invasive Surgery in Surgical Oncology (Dr. Narciso Navarro Jr., St. Luke's Medical Center Global City); Prevention Through Healthy Diet (Dr. Edwin Supit, FHP Health Center); and Benefits of HPV and Screening for Cervical Cancer (Dr. Dennis Albino, FHP Health Center).

In addition, vital signs were conducted to include blood pressure and blood sugar.

The 2-day event was a success with over 150 attendees.

### **Bill 141 and Bill 143**

The Public Hearing for Bill 143 which is an act to amend the "Natasha Act" by increasing enforcement, providing training and eliminating smoking in bars was conducted on September, 11 2015. The number of "Purple" Shirts and the number of people giving testimony in support of the bill was impressive. In fact, only one person testified in opposition to the bill. This Public Hearing was a great example of how the NCD Consortium is effective and has a spirit to move forward legislation that benefits the people of Guam.

The next piece of legislation to keep an eye out for is Bill 141, introduced by Vice Speaker BJ Cruz. This bill is an act relative to clarifying the definition of electronic cigarettes (E-Cigs). It also would raise the minimum age to access tobacco products and e-cigs to 21 years of age. A public hearing date has not yet been set so we need to keep on alert and I know we can have the same level attendance and support when it does roll out.

### **Family Fitness and Obesity Prevention Program**

The Friends of the Parks Program, a project of Island Girl Power (IGP) and the Ayuda Foundation, in collaboration with the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Program, CCC Prevention Action Team, and the Guam NCD Consortium's Physical Activity Action Team, completed the Family Fitness and Obesity Prevention Program in June 2015. The program was aimed at providing prevention, physical activity, and nutrition information and activities to children and their families in order to combat childhood obesity.

There were 3 main components to the 5-week (5 session) program: 1) Prevention topics and discussion, 2) Physical Activity, and 3) Nutrition. In addition, as a culminating event, Ozzie Sailors, a professional women's baseball player gave an inspirational talk and held a brief baseball drill session with the girls.

The Prevention component was a 30-45 minute presentation centered around healthy behaviors and choices. Different guest speakers shared a range of topics that brought greater awareness and positive reinforcement to all participants.

The Physical Activity component afforded participants 60 minutes of exercise beginning with a short walk to the neighboring park and a 45 minute exercise session with trained individuals from the community.

Maintenance and cleanup efforts in the park occurred on the days immediately preceding each Fitness Day with the help of numerous volunteers from the community, including neighborhood residents, Payless Markets, and Friends of the Park/Island Girl Power. In addition, our military community, specifically, members of the U.S. Airman Leadership School, generously donated their time, energy and resources to the park in a major clean up and refurbishing of park benches, walls, the bathroom, the grassy field, and the basketball court. They were able to repaint lines on the court and include a hopscotch area for the younger children. They erected a swing set with accompanying slide and minitrampoline. Children were invited to a recognition and graduation ceremony and dinner for all graduating military personnel at the Lotte Hotel for the conclusion of their coursework. Eight young girls were treated to a spectacular dinner courtesy of the Leadership school. The class leader directed her speech to the young girls she hopes will one day have dreams and aspirations of a career in the military. To ensure the sustainability of the park improvements, future classes of the Leadership Academy have discussed the possibility of monthly maintenance of the park area surrounding the basketball court.

In total, 15-20 participants attended the Family Fitness and Obesity Prevention Program each day. All were females age 8 to 54 years old. Participants noted they learned about cancer, smoking, staying fit, eating healthy, and exercising.

### FHP Health Center Celebrate Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Offers Patient Top-of-the-Line Imaging Services By Ms. Kyla Aquino

Each year, eligible TakeCare members (women, ages 40 and above) are invited to receive their annual mammogram at the FHP Health Center's Imaging Center. "It saddens me when I see individuals come in for screening at our Cancer Center, to find they currently have later stages of cancer. The only way to stop this trend is for women to participate in regular breast examinations," says Corey Roberts, FHP Clinic Administrator. Breast cancer is the second most common type of cancer in women. One woman in eight will be diagnosed with breast cancer during their lifetime. When detected early, breast cancer survival is increasingly high.

"Mammography is one of the most important procedures in breast cancer treatment in women, and is useful in the early detection and diagnosis of the cancer. As a result, FHP believes it is absolutely necessary to provide our patients top-of-the-line, state-of-the-art breast imaging equipment to ensure a more comfortable as well as secure experience," says Gerry Patricio, Sr. Clinical Manager for FHP's Imaging Center.

FHP offers Digital Mammography, which has several advantages over the standard screen film mammography. Advantages such as: higher contrast images for improved images of dense breast tissue, 5 percent less compression on average for better comfort, 22 percent less radiation than film, faster exam time, and higher efficiency with fewer retakes.

"This is our commitment to this battle with cancer. We are also actively participating in Breast Cancer Awareness Month with an intense marketing campaign as an encouragement for as many as possible to come in during the month of October for their exam," explains Roberts.

"As one of the largest multi-specialty clinics on-island, FHP Health Center provides the most comprehensive medical imaging services," says Patricio. In addition to mammography, the FHP Imaging Center offers Bone Mineral Density (DEXA Scan), Computed Axial Tomography (CT Scan), Echocardiogram, Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) 3.0T, Ultrasound and X-ray (computerized radiography).

"Our greatest desire is for cancer to be detected in its earlier stages for the greatest ability to fight this life threatening disease," explains Roberts.

"FHP Health Center offers Medical (Urgent Care, Adult Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, Occupational Health, Specialty – Cancer Center), Laboratory, Pharmacy, Dental and Home Health/Hospice. This is what sets us apart as the One-Stop health center on our Island," says Brenda Sana, FHP Health Center Senior Manager, Primary Care and Specialty Clinics.
