Alee I Catherine's Home- Women's Shelter:

During the 4th Quarter of July 01, 2019 to September 30, 2019, Alee I Catherine's Home of Family Violence Domestic Assault shelter received a total of four hundred and sixty-four (464) hotline calls:

Sixty-eight (68) possible client referral calls to include- twenty-nine (29) self-referrals, twenty-eight (28) from VARO, two (2) from GPD-DART, two (2) from GLS, two (2) from Sentor Ridgell Office, two (2) from GMH and three (3) from Dededo Dialysis Clinic. Two hundred and fifty (250) active clients inquiring/giving information, fifty-seven (57) calls for active clients, twenty-eight (28) past client inquiring/giving information, eight (8) calls for former clients, twenty-two (22) outside agency calls inquiring/giving information, twenty (20) program/staff related calls, eight (8) calls for donations inquiries, and three (3) hang ups.

Alee I provided services for a total of twenty (20) clients for the 4th Quarter, sixteen (16) new clients, and four (4) clients from the previous quarter.

JULY 2019

(Client #2416) Client entered the shelter on July 01, 2019 at 8:29pm by herself. The client is thirty (30) year old, married female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her husband, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by *Guam Memorial Hospital Emergency Room*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, toiletries, clothing, and transportation services. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client

is not sure if she wants assistance in applying for a protective order. Client exited the shelter on July 02, 2019 at 1:40pm. It is unknown where the client transitioned to, since client did not come back to the shelter after the 8pm curfew. Client was in the shelter for one (1) day.

(Client #2418) Client entered the shelter on July 03, 2019 at 7:55pm by herself. The client is forty-two (42) year old, single female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her ex-boyfriend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was self-referred. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay and transportation services. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client volunteered to exit the shelter on July 03, 2019 at 8:15pm. It is unknown where the client transitioned to. Client was in the shelter for one (1) day.

(Client #2417) Client entered the shelter on July 01, 2019 at 9:56pm with her two (2) minor children and one (1) minor grandchild ages: ten (10) month old, fifteen (15), sixteen (16) years old. The client is forty-two (42) year old, single female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client's minor daughter is the victim of sexual assault by the step grand-father, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by *Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO)*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals and transportation services. Client was assisted with transportation services to the *Guam Police Department Dededo Precinct* and *Juvenile Investigation* in Tiyan. Client was also transported for grocery shopping at *Payless Supermarket* and *Cost U-Less*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department*. Client did not want assistance in applying for a protective order. Client was evicted due to violating one of the shelter's rules and transitioned out with her two (2) minor children and her one (1) minor grandchild on July 10, 2019 at 4:55pm. It is unknown where client transitioned to. Client was in the shelter for nine (9) days.

(Client #2351-1) Client entered the shelter on July 04, 2019 at 9:33pm with her one (1) minor child age five (5) year old. On July 06, 2019 Client brought her other five (5) minor children ages: ten (10) month old, two (2), three (3), seven (7) and eight (8) years old. The client is twenty-seven (27) year old, single female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her boyfriend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was self-referred. The

incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, clothing and transportation services. Client was assisted with transportation to get prior authorization from *Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS)* in Mangilao. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department*. Client not sure she wants assistance in applying for a protective order. Client was evicted due to violating one of the shelter's rules and transitioned out with her six (6) minor children on July 11, 2019 at 1:02pm. It is unknown where client transitioned to. Client was in the shelter for six (6) days.

(Client #2415) Client entered the shelter on June 06, 2019 at 4:23pm with her one (1) minor child age fifteen (15) year old. The client is thirty-four (34) year old, single female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of emotional abuse by her ex-boyfriend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was self-referred. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drops off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, toiletries, clothing, and transportation services. Client was also assisted with transportation services to *Guam Housing Urban and Renewal Authority (GHURA)* in Sinajana to follow up on her public housing with a Notice of Continued Interest submission in Sinajana office, to *Social Security Office* in Tiyan, and to *Guam Judiciary Court* in Agana. Client submitted resumes via online on June 13, 2019 for employment for the following companies; JP Superstore, Inland Builders Corporation, and PISA Security. Client applied at Fish Eye on June 14, 2019 and received a call back for interview on June 17, 2019 at 3pm. Client is not sure if she wants assistance in applying for a protective order. Client was evicted due to violating one of the shelter's rules and transitioned out with her one (1) minor child on July 11, 2019 at 6:35pm. It is unknown where client transitioned to. Client was in the shelter for thirty-five (35) days.

Client was able to get her other twin child, age two (2) year old, back from her family member and is now in the client's care. The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her boyfriend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was

referred by *Salvation Army*. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, clothing, toiletries, transportation services and respite care for her children. Client was assisted with transportation services to take her children to and from school, to *Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS)* in Dededo and Mangilao, to *Woman, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program* to follow up on her public benefits, to *GHURA* in Sinajana for continued interest and in Yona. Client was also assisted with transportation to the *Guam Police Department Dededo Precinct* and for grocery shopping at *Payless Supermarket* and *Cost U-Less*, *Micronesian Legal Center* in Harmon Industrial, *Harmon Loop Dental*, *Guam Regional Medical City (GRMC) Emergency Room*, *Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC)*, and *Mega Drug Store* for her medication. Client was referred to *Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC)* for counseling. Client was provided with an application for the Head Start Program for her children who were eligible for the program and was provided transportation to *International Health Partners (IHP) Medical Group* for the PPD skin testing. Client was transported to and from CPK (*California Pizza Kitchen*) to participate in her daughter's fieldtrip for school. Client was assisted in scheduling an appointment with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services to obtain a copy of her I-94. In regards to her housing, client was assisted in applying for *Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA)* and was transported to *GHURA* in Sinajana for continued interest. Client also applied for *GHURA Section 8 Program* and was selected for the lottery. Two of her older children were enrolled for the no cost summer camp program in June 11, 2019 until August 14, 2019. Client's fourth child has been enrolled for head start and awaiting to be called if selected. Client received her I-94 March 15, 2019 a copy was made on June 13, 2019 and placed in her file. Client filed for Child Support in 2017 with GLS and a recent follow-up on April 2019 has no new information. Client is currently on the waiting list for *GHURA* housing and has turned in all documents required. Client was assisted with applying for the *Salvation Army's Emergency Solutions Grant and Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (ESG-HPRRP)*. Client has an existing protective order and a copy is in her file. **Client is an active client and has been in the shelter for four hundred and ninety-nine (499) days.**

Client #2397-1: Client entered the shelter on January 02, 2019 at 2:35pm. Client is twenty-four (24) year old, single female, Korean and a U.S. Citizen. The client is victim of sexual assault by her boyfriend's friend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by *Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO)*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at

one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, toiletries, clothing and transportation services. Client was assisted with transportation services to *Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS)* in Dededo and in Mangilao, *Women's Health Clinic, Woman, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program, Express Drugstore* and for grocery shopping to *Payless Supermarket*. Client was also assisted with transportation to *Guam Behavioral Health & Wellness Center (GBHWC)* for counseling session, *Attorney General in ITC*, and *Guam Housing Urban and Renewal Authority (GHURA)*. In regards to her housing, client was provided an application for the *Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant-Homelessness Prevention Rapid Re-Housing Program (ESG-HPRRP)*. Client was assisted with applying for the Online Pre-Application for *Guam Housing Urban and Renewal Authority (GHURA) AMP#4*. Client had the baby on June 28, 2019 at *Sagua* and made the decision to give her son for adoption. Client wanted assistance in applying for a protective order and was referred to *Guam Legal Services Corporation (GLS)*. Client was able to obtain the protective order and a copy is in her file. Client is currently an active volunteer in a non-profit organization. **Client is an active client and has been in the shelter for two hundred and ten (210) days.**

Client #2152-1: Client entered the shelter on February 13, 2019 at 5:51pm with her five (5) minor children ages: one (1), four (4), six (6), ten (10) and twelve (12) years old. Client is forty-one (41) year old, married pregnant female, Palauan and a Republic of Palau Citizen. The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her husband, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by *Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO)*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up and drop off at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, toiletries, clothing, transportation services, and respite care for her children. Client was also assisted with transportation to *Department of Public Health and Social Services, Guam Legal Services, Micronesian Legal Services in Agana, Harmon Loop Dental, Attorney General in ITC and Mega Drugs*. Client was transported for shopping at *Cost U Less* and *Pay-Less Supermarket*. Client attended the Parent Workshop in Yigo and was transported there and picked up. Client was also assisted with applying for public benefits and *WIC (Women, Infant, and Children)*. Client withdrew the assistance of obtaining a new passport with client's married name with the *Micronesian Resource Center*. Client was assisted in enrolling her child into elementary school. Client's two (2) older children aged twelve (12) and ten (10) were transferred to the same school as the six (6) year old on March 11, 2019. Three of her older children started summer camp on June 3, 2019 until August 14, 2019. Client was assisted to obtain her photo for her I-94

application. Client enrolled fourth child in head start. In regards to her housing, client was assisted with applying for the Online Pre-Application for *Guam Housing Urban and Renewal Authority (GHURA) AMP#3 and AMP#4*. Client is currently gathering all required documents to turn in for *(GHURA) AMP#3 and AMP#4*. Client's perpetrator was incarcerated and released on May 29, 2019. Client wanted assistance in applying for a protective order and was referred to *Guam Legal Services Corporation (GLS)*. Client was able to obtain the protective order and a copy is in her file. **Client is an active client and has been in the shelter for one hundred and sixty-eight (168) days.**

Client #2419: Client entered the shelter on July 05, 2019 at 5:43pm by herself. Client brought her three (3) minor children ages: six (6), three (3) and thirteen (13) years old on July 12, 2019. Client also brought her oldest child age fourteen (14) year old in July 16, 2019. Client is thirty-four (34) year old, married female, Chamorro and a U.S. Citizen. The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her husband, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by *Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO)*. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was escorted to the shelter by staff and brought her POV with authorization letter from her family member. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals and toiletries. Client was provided document to turn in to the *Woman, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program and Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) Supplemental Nutritional and Assistance Program (SNAP and Welfare)*. Client was referred by *Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO)*. The incident was reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick-up and drop-off at one of our

shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, clothing, transportation and toiletries services. Client volunteered to exit the shelter with her six (6) minor children on August 06, 2019 at 10:04am. Client was not sure if she wanted assistance in applying for a protective order. Client transitioned to the mother of her boyfriend. Client was in the shelter for four (4) days.

The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her ex-boyfriend, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was self-referred. The incident was not reported to the *Guam Police Department (GPD)*. Client was assisted with transportation services for pick-up and drop-off at one of our shelter designated locations. Services provided included personal care, teaching life skills, transportation to and from school, visitations and various appointments, as well as recreational activities.

Client #142-2018-1: For the eleven (11) year old male minor, he was struggling with behavioral issues. Minor was seen at I'Famaguonta for intake on March 01, 2019 and had an appointment

with Dr. Ismael on June 17, 2019. Minor has not yet participated in any counseling services or group therapy. Due to having multiple physical aggressions towards staff and other children, the minor exited the shelter on July 02, 2019 to the custody of Child Protective Services Social Worker Lydia. Minor entered the shelter on October 14, 2018 (291 days).


