Alee I Catherine's Home- Women's Shelter:

During the 4th Quarter of July 01, 2019 to September 30, 2019, Alee I Catherine's Home of Family Violence Domestic Assault shelter received a total of four hundred and sixty-four (464) hotline calls:

Sixty-eight (68) possible client referral calls to include- twenty-nine (29) self-referrals, twenty-eight (28) from VARO, two (2) from GPD-DART, two (2) from GLS, two (2) from Sentor Ridgell Office, two (2) from GMH and three (3) from Dededo Dialysis Clinic. Two hundred and fifty (250) active clients inquiring/giving information, fifty-seven (57) calls for active clients, twenty-eight (28) past client inquiring/giving information, eight (8) calls for former clients, twenty-two (22) outside agency calls inquiring/giving information, twenty (20) program/staff related calls, eight (8) calls for donations inquiries, and three (3) hang ups.

Alee I provided services for a total of twenty (20) clients for the 4th Quarter, sixteen (16) new clients, and four (4) clients from the previous quarter.

The client is a victim of intimate partner/domestic violence-specifically that of physical and emotional abuse by her husband, whom she was living with prior to entering shelter. Client was referred by Guam Memorial Hospital Emergency Room. The incident was reported to the Guam Police Department (GPD). Client was assisted with transportation services for pick up at one of our shelter designated locations. Client was assisted with shelter stay, meals, toiletries, clothing, and transportation services. The incident was reported to the Guam Police Department (GPD). Client

Client's two (2) older children aged twelve (12) and ten (10) were transferred to the same school as the six (6) year old on March 11, 2019. Three of her older children started summer camp on June 3, 2019 until August 14, 2019. Client was assisted to obtain her photo for her I-94

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application. Client enrolled fourth child in head start. In regards to her housing, client was assisted with applying for the Online Pre-Application for Guam Housing Urban and Renewal Authority (GHURA) AMP#3 and AMP#4. Client is currently gathering all required documents to turn in for (GHURA) AMP#3 and AMP#4. Client's perpetrator was incarcerated and released on May 29, 2019. Client wanted assistance in applying for a protective order and was referred to Guam Legal Services Corporation (GLS). Client was able to obtain the protective order and a copy is in her file. Client is an active client and has been in the shelter for one hundred and sixty-eight (168) days.
