Who Reports?

- Healthcare practitioners who treat & diagnose cancers
- Public/Private institutions that diagnose or treat cancer patients
- Labs that positively identify cancer in tissue specimens
- Public/Private agencies that provide financial or other assistance to cancer patients and their families

What to Report?

- Patient demographics
 - Primary site of the cancer
 - Tumor histology
 - Cancer staging information
 - Treatment including surgery, radiation, chemotherapy
 - Current status of the patient
- Monthly, quarterly or according to the minimum mandatory reporting schedule:
- Cases diagnosed between Jan. 1 - June 30:
Due by Dec. 31 of the same year
 - Cases diagnosed between July 1 - Dec. 31:
Due by June 30 of the following year

When to Report?

How to Report?

- Register for use of the secure online WebPlus reporting site;
- Call the GUAM CANCER REGISTRY for an account set-up.
- Or send patient report via confidential fax to 734-2990.
