WHAT is the JIC? The Joint Information Center (JIC) puts together and gives to the public all official information residents need about a disaster. In this case, the JIC will provide information to educate residents about the North Korea threat, although there is no imminent danger.

WHO is the JIC? JIC is a partnership between various government and military agencies.

WHY is the JIC important? The JIC gives the public one clear

source for accurate information.

WHEN did the JIC get together? The JIC was called together in April 2013 to help the public get the most current information about North Korea's escalating rhetoric and the best actions for residents who have concerns about the situation.

HOW do we get info from the JIC? The JIC will be sending out information via the media, the Mayors, consulate offices, social media, etc. *See below for more.*

How do I learn more? Who will answer my questions or tell me more information?

- Anyone can contact the JIC for more information or specific information about how they can better prepare.
- The JIC is available via phone, email or through social media.
- Members of the JIC can answer questions about how to be prepared, how to respond in any type of situation, potential impacts and concerns to public health and how to talk to other community members about the situation.
- The JIC will be releasing fact sheets about specific topics during the upcoming weeks to help the community better prepare.
