II. DPHSS Sanitation Rules and Regulations

2. Housekeeping Requirements	-Frequent cleaning and disinfecting before school, during, and after school -Disinfecting frequently touched surfaces

3. Handwashing Units	 Antibacterial soap and sanitary paper towel are available at all handwashing units Supplies are frequently checked and refilled
4. Restrooms	 Toilet and Urinals maintain 6 feet safe distance in line with Executive Order guidance Staff on site to maintain social distancing between students/staff Markings placed on the concrete outside of the bathrooms indicating the required spacing for those waiting to enter the bathroom

III. COVID-Related Protocols

1. Masks/Face Shields	• Expected practices for all students, teachers, staff 1. All students, teachers, and staff must have facial masks or cloth masks on at all time.
	2. Teach and reinforce all students, teachers and staff the importance of face masks, proper usage, storing, and disposable of.
	3. Face shields may be used in addition to face masks but cannot be worn in place of a face mask.
	4. Masks with exhalation valve are prohibited as it does not stop the virus droplets from escaping and possibly infecting others.
	5. Those with high-risk or special medical needs, other alternatives and adaptations may be considered by consulting with a healthcare provider and providing the school nurse with the necessary documents indicating such recommendations.
	6. Masks will be available on hand to provide to those who forgot their mask or any broken masks within the day.

2.	Attention to High-Risk students and/or employees	 Recognition of high risk individuals – Who should know? What should be done to protect identity? For the students with high-risk medical conditions, the school nurse and student's teachers will be in communication regarding the student and how to continue to provide a safe environment on campus and in the classrooms. Staff with high-risk medical conditions will be in contact with our school nurse and their healthcare provider for recommendations and how to remain safe during this pandemic. Special consideration for high-risk individuals must be accompanied by a letter from their healthcare provider School-wide precautions For those students, teachers, and staff who are high-risk, may be considered to remain on online learning or teleworking from home during the pandemic. Students, staff, and teachers must remain home if they are sick.

	2. Detail Cleaning and Disinfection	 Frequent and intense cleaning and disinfecting of the campus/facility using safe cleaning products and known to work against the virus. Face Covering	-Mandatory face covering must be worn at all times -Masks with inhalation valves are prohibited as it does not stop the viral droplets from escaping and possibly infecting others -Schools to provide mask to students who do not have one or arrive to campus without one -Masks on hand and provided for soiled or broken masks
5. Hand Hygiene	-Frequent and proper handwashing with antibacterial soap and running water for 20 secondsHand washing supplies maintained at all wash stations - Frequent and adequate access to hand sanitizers containing 60% of alcohol or greater
6. Drop-off Procedures	 Drop-off for students starts at 7:15 a.m. No parents or visitors will be allowed on campus while students are entering the campus Staff on site at all entry ways to check temperatures using non-contact thermometers Monitoring of handwashing, hand sanitizing, mandatory masks, Staff will escort students to designated classrooms 6 feet spacing marks on all walkways to promote social distancing Students will be escorted to their classrooms and be with their teachers as they wait for school to be in session. If a teacher is not in their classroom, they will be escorted to the cafeteria for care; teachers will be required to pick-up and escort students to the classrooms
7. Cohort Activities	 Group assignments can be conducted with mandatory social distancing Sharing of supplies or equipment is prohibited
8. Student Access to Drinking Water	 Parents are advised to provide disposable water bottles or thermos/flasks and labeled with the students name and homeroom Water fountains have been removed, and replaced with a water dispenser
9. Classroom arrangements	 Desks have been arranged to ensure 6 feet minimum separation between individuals Desks with plastic/plexiglass partitions have been placed in each classroom

	 Each student will have their dedicated desk to avoid cross-contamination Students are prohibited from sharing equipment or supplies
10. Restriction of non-essential campus visitors, volunteers, activities	 All parents and visitors subject to temperature and symptoms check prior to entering the campus. All parents and visitors must sign in and indicate full name, contact numbers, and reason for visit. All information will be provided to public health for the sole purpose of contact tracing. Parents and visitors will not be allowed on campus while students are entering or exiting the campus. Parents can drop off payments in our drop box or submit payment electronically via paypal on the school's website All non-essential business can be conducted over the phone, via zoom, or by appointment only to avoid overcrowding of the campus and administration office The allowing of exchange students from Japan, China, and South Korea have been suspended until further notice Parent Teacher Conference can be conducted over the phone or via zoom. Parent's are also given the option to communicate with their child's teacher via email.
11. Restrictions on offices, lounges, communal spaces	 All faculty and staff have been given a staggered break schedule to avoid crowding in the lounge. Parties of social gatherings are prohibited. Reinforcement of social distancing and mandatory masks while in the offices and common areas. Faculty and staff are advised to consume snacks and meals inside their offices or classrooms. If meals will be consumed in the lounge, no more than 12 people are allowed in the lounge at one time to avoid crowding. All faculty and staff are required 6 feet apart from the other while consuming meals
12. Daily Activities: Arrival and Dismissal	 Arrival of students will begin at 7:15 a.m. and commence at 3:15 p.m. School staff and students are screened with temperature and symptom check.

	 Anyone presenting fever or obvious symptoms will not be allowed entry and must return home. Students will be spaced out a minimum of 6 feet as they enter and walk through the campus
13. Daily Activities: Recess, Breaks, Lunch	 The cafeteria is closed off to students for consumption of meals; Students will be consuming snacks and lunch meals in their dedicated classrooms with their homeroom teachers to avoid unnecessary movement and overcrowding. Students are prohibited from activities involving "contact." Students will be allowed some fresh air outside, but must maintain social distancing and mandatory wearing of face masks
14. Bus Service: DPW Protocols	Protocols and Procedures to be cleared and monitored by DPW
15. Bus Service: Orientation for students and parents	SACS has temporarily suspended bussing services provided by DPW until further notice
